Comments:

The combination barracks is based on a special plan drawn by the State Division of Architect. Although there are some elements of the USFS-CCC "D-11" design in this building, the pyramidal hip roof with ridge stone chimney, and general "L" floor plan are significant departures from the "D-11" style. The combination barracks has been remodeled and enlarged on several occasions since original construction. It still retains a good degree of its historic architectural integrity. The surrounding area has also undergone significant change, further reducing the property's historic integrity.

Comments:

There are five 32' x 85' truck garages in the CDF building collection that were based on a variation of one of the USFS-CCC "N" series plans. The subject building suffers some historic architectural integrity loss due to the conversion of a vehicle stall to office space, door replacements, and minor fenestration changes. The area around the compound has greatly changed since the 1930s, further eroding the overall historic character of the property. However, all three recorded buildings at Fortuna are considered important cultural resources.

Comments:

The building is based on the CCC era "L" working plan series for equipment garages. As with the neighboring seven bay garage, the subject building suffers some historic architectural integrity loss with the replacement of doors, exterior cladding changes, and glazing alterations. There are three 26' x 60' five bay equipment garages that predate 1945 in the CDF building collection.

Comments:

This is the only 27' x 62' barracks in the CDF building collection that dates from the CCC era. However, the building was remodeled and enlarged in the 1960s. The original barracks (27' x 52') is probably based on the plans used for a 25' x 40' design found at many locations around the State. Fenestration, cladding, and footprint changes have degraded the overall historic character of the building. The barracks has also been relocated within the compound, being east of its original site.

Comments:

As with the associated eight bay truck garage, this building has undergone relatively few changes since its original construction in 1938. The building is nearly equivalent to the truck garage in its perimeter measurement. This is the only CCC era warehouse in the CDF building collection to fit this footprint. The overall setting is good, with minimal degradation caused by newer buildings and the relocation of Highway 101. The heavily timbered area greatly buffers the impact of the neighboring highway corridor.

Comments:

This building originally served as a ranger's office. It's surmised that the original building measured approximately 24' x 28'. Because the additions and revisions have all but erased the original office appearance, the building is not given a rarity score. It is, as redesigned, the only house of this type that was reviewed for this project. The house has been converted back to office use. In the late 1980s all the divided light wood frame windows were replaced with aluminum frame pseudo divided light windows. Doors have also been replaced and fenestration changed. The west and south elevations have been re-sided with pressed hardboard siding. Although still an attractive building, these and other cosmetic changes have degraded the building's historic architectural integrity.

Comments:

The building served initially as a gas and oil house being used later as a "diesel house" according to older site maps. The building has been encased in metal sheeting which greatly alters its original appearance. The fuel pump has also been removed. This appears to be the only small footprint, gable front gas and oil house dating from the CCC era in the CDF building collection. The other gas and oil house of similar design is believed to have been re-built in the 1960s. The Howard Forest building could be relatively easy to restore to its original appearance.

Comments:

This is the best surviving example of a house based on the USFS-CCC "A-14" working plan series in the CDF building collection under review for this project. The "A-14" planning series was designed to accommodate future additions, consequently the later vintage 10' x 13' front facing gable wing addition is not seen as an adverse impact to this house. The installation of pressed hard board and other cosmetic alterations are having a deleterious effect.

Comments:

There are six stations in the CDF property inventory that have what the S-5 Forms designated as a "military surplus building." Seven buildings exist, all of which are 20 feet wide and vary from 48 feet to 88 feet in length. Three of them served as combination barracks, two others included a truck garage at one end. One site has a separate barracks and messhall. The buildings have also been identified as "Army surplus." They are believed to have been supplied to the Army during World War Two for temporary camp sites. These are rectangular, gable roof "bolt together" buildings which originally had both steel framing and metal cladding. The building at this site served originally as a combination barracks but has been converted to a storage building. In the 1980s it was covered with pressed hardboard which was also installed over the window openings. This and other modifications have severely diminished the building's historic architectural integrity.

Comments:

Comments:

The site is located in a lightly settled area on the outskirts of Middletown. This compound served as the Lake County (and Lake-Colusa) Ranger Unit Headquarters until the early 1970s.

In the mid-1960s a messhall was constructed next to the subject building. The combination barracks was then internally reconfigured to include sleeping quarters, bath, recreation room, and laundry floor plan. Comments:

A 1941 truck garage was located at this site until the early 1960s at which time the Jefferson Street extension forced a relocation of the building. Architectural drawings (reference CDF Plan 567) and the site's S-5 Form tend to indicate that the original garage was replaced circa 1962. However, the truck garage portion of the existing building shares common elements with the older USFS-CCC "N" working plans suggesting a connection to the past. The truck garage portion is 32' x 85' and the garage has vehicle entry and other detailing indicative of the older design series. It's possible some of the original garage was reused in the construction of the existing building. There are five 32' x 85' truck garages in the CDF building collection which predate 1945. When the subject building was built a 32' x 31' office wing was constructed on the west gable end. Since then it appears that the garage doors have been replaced, as well as a few other cosmetic revisions.
