**PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

The project area consists of 60 acres of commercial timberland between 1900' and 2100' elevation. The project is limited to hand line construction using chainsaws and hand tools. Brush strips from 6-10 feet wide will be created, followed by a 4 to 6 foot wide scrape to bare mineral soil. All trees greater than 6" diameter will be left uncut and no more than 1.5% of the natural vegetation on site will be disturbed in any given year. It is expected that re-vegetation will occur naturally within 2 years. No work of any kind will occur within 100' of a watercourse. Training will occur annually in the spring, prior to fire season. Limited disposal of some cut material will occur by lopping, scattering, chipping, mastication or piling and burning. The project area is covered by an approved timber harvest plan and has been reviewed by Cal Fire for timber operations. Timber operations have not yet commenced.

**REASONS PROJECT IS EXEMPT**

This project involves the use of hand tools, and disposal of some cut material will occur by lopping, scattering, chipping, mastication or piling and burning. The property has previously been masticated in 2004. The resulting condition will be only slightly altered from the existing conditions of the land. Vegetation will be only slightly modified in terms of age distribution on limited areas, less than 10% of the total project area, creating greater diversity of age classes and less stagnant canopy. A CAL FIRE Registered Professional Forester has consulted with the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, conducted an environmental review of the project and determined, pursuant to 14 CCR § 15300.2 (a), (b), (c) and (f) that no cumulative impacts will occur and no historical resources or unusual circumstances exist which would prevent the use of a Categorical Exemption.

Field review by CAL FIRE staff confirmed that no exceptions apply which would preclude the use of a Notice of Exemption for this project. The Department has concluded that no significant environmental impact would occur to aesthetics, agriculture and forestland/timberland, air quality, biological resources, cultural resources, geology and soils, greenhouse gas emissions, hazards and hazardous materials, hydrology and water quality, land use planning, mineral resources, noise, population and housing, public services, recreation, transportation/traffic, or to utilities and service systems. Documentation of the environmental review completed by the Department is kept on file at NEU Headquarters in Auburn, California.
